

Welcome to your new Logan County's River Current! Read on to learn all about your free weekly community newspaper.

What is it? A weekly community newspaper dedicated to the readers of DeGraff, Quincy and West Liberty residing in Logan County.

Who publishes it?

Brown Publishing Company. Its partner publication is the Urbana Daily Citizen.

How much is it?

Free delivery to those with West Liberty, DeGraff and Quincy zip codes residing in Logan County, free to pick up at local merchants and available for cost of postage and handling to all others.

When will it circulate?

Each Thursday, 52 weeks a year. Delivery via U.S. Postal Service.

When is it printed?

Wednesday, in order to meet the U.S. Postal deadline for mailing.

What are the community news deadlines?

Electronic submissions from the community for each Thursday edition should arrive by 5 p.m. on the prior Monday. Paper submissions should arrive in the Urbana office by Thursday at 5 p.m. Breaking news will be deadlined by the River Current staff as needed.

By distributing your community newspaper to all of the community, everyone is informed and involved. The newspaper is strongest when the community is participating.

Will you print information on class reunions, marriages, births, birthday parties, anniversaries, church fund-raisers and other community gatherings?

Absolutely and for free. Just send them in and watch for them in the River Current.

What about online?

Your River Current has its very own Web site ([www.weeklycurrents.com](http://www.weeklycurrents.com)) and all River Current editions will be archived and available for free all over the world for viewing.

What if I want an extra copy?

Just visit your local villages and pick one up for free... but get there early just in case!

How can I make the new River Current a success?

Send in news items, community items, sports items and anything else that interests the West Liberty, DeGraff or Quincy communities. The pages belong to the readers of the above mentioned communities. And most importantly, keep the River Current vibrant by shopping at the local advertisers who are supporting your community newspaper!

How do I place a complete, biographical obituary in the River Current?

If it runs in the Urbana Daily Citizen and has a connection with either West Liberty, DeGraff or Quincy, it will automatically run in the River Current for no additional cost. Obituaries not appearing in the Urbana Daily Citizen can be e-mailed to [jkeeran@weeklycurrents.com](mailto:jkeeran@weeklycurrents.com) and will run free of charge as long as there is a reasonable relationship to the area. Obituaries

submitted in any other form besides e-mail will be charged a \$50 fee. Pictures are also welcome. A disclaimer will be printed with obituaries indicating the timeliness of services is dependent on the weekly circulation date. All approved obituaries will be placed online daily, so the community can follow the reports in a timely fashion on the Internet at [www.weeklycurrents.com](http://www.weeklycurrents.com).

What about a short death notice?

All are free upon request. A death notice includes date and place of death and date and place of visitation, services and burial. These will also be updated daily on the Internet at [www.weeklycurrents.com](http://www.weeklycurrents.com).
